

Global equity markets fell in the first quarter due to ongoing pandemic-related challenges including supply chain disruptions and rising inflation, which was further exacerbated by the Russia-Ukraine conflict. The surge in energy and commodity costs dampened global growth expectations which was later followed by interest rate hikes by several central banks. In this environment, the MSCI ACWI ex USA Net Index returned -5.44% and the International ACWI ex-U.S. Equity strategy outperformed the benchmark.

The SGA Alpha Model had modestly positive performance for the quarter among non-U.S. large cap equities. Within the Model, the Valuation category made a strong positive contribution, delivering particularly strong performance in January, led by SGA's Residual Income Model. The Growth and Sentiment categories both detracted offsetting much of the contribution from Valuation, while the Quality category had a roughly neutral contribution.

Stock selection was positive in Information Technology and Energy, partially offset by weak selection in Industrials, Utilities, and Consumer Staples. In Energy, positive selection was driven by Petroleo Brasileiro which benefitted from the strong increase in oil prices. In Information Technology, portfolio positions in defensive software firms such as Check Point Software drove positive selection. Weaker selection in Industrials was driven by Deutsche Post which was impacted by rising fuel costs and lower global GDP growth estimates. In Consumer Staples, the Russian supermarket chain Magnit PJSC detracted due to the recent Russia-Ukraine conflict and was sold during the quarter.

Stock selection was positive in the emerging markets segment of the portfolio, especially in China and South Korea, partially offset by weak selection in the U.K. and Canada. Positive stock selection in China was driven by banks that were more insulated from the crisis in Europe such as Postal Savings Bank of China and China Construction Bank. In South Korea, the same theme drove positive selection from portfolio positions in Hana Financial Group and Woori Financial Group. In Canada, auto parts supplier Magna International underperformed as rising raw materials costs and lower global GDP growth estimates weighed on its outlook. In the U.K., steel producer Evraz declined due to the company's exposure to Russian assets.

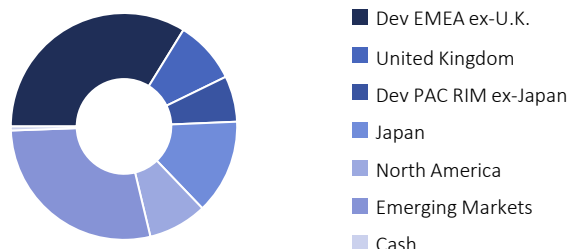
