

SGA International World ex-U.S. Equity

Global markets fell in the first quarter due to ongoing pandemic-related challenges including supply chain disruptions and rising inflation, which was further exacerbated by the Russia-Ukraine conflict. The surge in energy and commodity costs dampened global growth expectations which was later followed by interest rate hikes by several central banks. International stocks, as measured by the MSCI World ex USA Net Index, returned -4.81% in the first quarter, in this environment, the International World ex-U.S. Equity strategy modestly outperformed the benchmark.

The SGA Alpha Model had negative performance for the quarter among non-U.S. large cap developed equities. Within the Model, the Growth and Sentiment categories were the largest detractors, while Quality also slightly underperformed, partially offset by strong performance from the Valuation category, particularly in January and February, where SGA's Residual Income Model was the top performing factor.

Stock selection was strong in Industrials, Information Technology, and Communication Services, partially offset by weak selection in Financials and Health Care. In Information Technology, Check Point Software reported billings growth, while in Communication Services, drove positive selection. In Industrials, trading company Mitsui & Co. benefited from higher metals exposure, while defense firm Thales and Zim Integrated Shipping also contributed. In Financials, European banks Credit Agricole and Barclays underperformed. In Materials, miners Rio Tinto and BHP advanced, offset by Evraz which had direct exposure to the Russia-Ukraine conflict. In Health Care, Hoya detracted.

Stock selection was strong in Japan, Italy, and France, offset by weak selection in the U.K., Denmark, and Canada. In Canada, chip shortages impacted auto parts supplier Magna, while CI Financial fell in sympathy with global markets despite strong asset gathering trends. Retail companies retreated after reporting moderating sales trends and included Denmark based Pandora and U.K. retailers Next and JD Sports Fashion. U.K. miner Evraz also underperformed. In France, Ipsen beat earnings expectations, and in Italy, energy equipment maker Tenaris advanced on rising oil demand. In Japan, contributors included Mitsui & Co., Sumitomo Chemical, and Nintendo which announced new games in its pipeline.

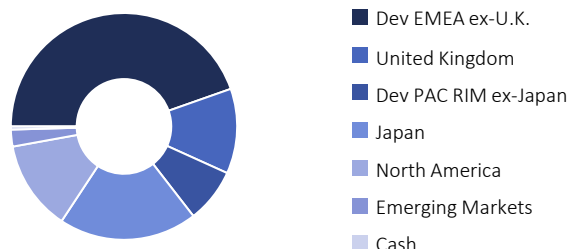
