

SGA International All Cap Equity

Global equities moved higher during the quarter as Middle East geopolitical tensions and their impact on oil prices subsided, and ongoing investment across the AI ecosystem contributed to market strength. International stocks, as measured by the MSCI World ex USA IMI Net Index, returned 9.90% in the second quarter. In this environment, the International All Cap Equity strategy outperformed the benchmark.

The SGA Alpha Model had negative performance for the quarter among non-U.S. developed equities, as solid June performance was not enough to overcome underperformance in the first two months. Within the Model, the Quality, Growth, and Valuation categories all detracted. The underperformance was partially offset by positive Sentiment category performance as well as positive interaction between categories as the combined Model outperformed the categories' standalone contributions.

From a sector perspective, stock selection drove the outperformance. Selection was strongest in Industrials, led by robust Alpha Model performance and a notable contribution from machine tool maker Tsugami after raising profit guidance due to data center cooling demand. Selection was also positive in Materials and Information Technology as AI server demand lifted their respective top contributors, namely, metals producer Mitsui Kinzoku, for its copper foil, and electronic component manufacturer Murata. Memory chip maker Kioxia also contributed, benefitting from pricing power due to supply tightness in the industry. The positive selection was partially offset by weak Model performance in Consumer Staples, where baked goods maker Aryzta declined on margin pressure from weak consumer sentiment.

From a country standpoint, stock selection primarily drove the outperformance, although country allocation also contributed, a result of contributions from non-benchmark Taiwan and Hungary. Selection was strongest in Japan, Australia, and the U.K., partially offset by negative selection in Canada and Switzerland. In Japan, strong Alpha Model performance drove broad selection, buoyed by significant contributions from Tsugami, Murata, Kioxia, and Mitsui Kinzoku. The Model also performed well in Australia, led by infrastructure firm Ventia, which secured new contract wins. In the U.K., NatWest rose due to strong client activity from a resilient macro backdrop. The poor selection in Canada was driven by oil producer Suncor, which fell with oil prices, while Aryzta detracted in Switzerland.

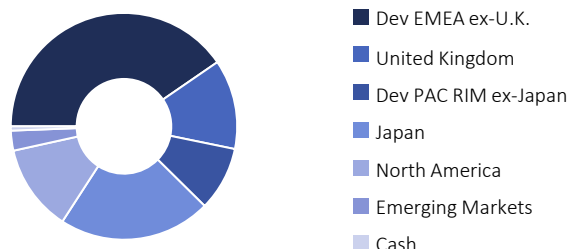

Please note that the maximum model annual management fee for the respective period may differ from the actual investment advisory fees incurred by clients.

The annual composite dispersion presented is a gross of fees asset weighted standard deviation calculated for the accounts in the composite the entire year and is only presented for periods with more than five accounts in for the entire year. Policies for valuing investments, calculating performance, and preparing GIPS Reports are available upon request.

From September 30, 2013 to March 31, 2014, composite policy included two scenarios that require the temporary removal of any portfolio due to a client initiated significant cash inflow or outflow: 1) When the cash inflow or outflow represents from over 5% to 10% of portfolio assets and it takes longer than five trading days to reduce cash levels to less than 5%, and 2) When the cash inflow or outflow represents more than 10% of portfolio assets. The temporary removal of such an account occurs at the beginning of the month in which the significant cash flow occurs and the account re-enters the composite at the beginning of the month after the cash level in the portfolio is reduced to less than 5%. Additional information regarding the treatment of significant cash flows is available upon request.
